

The 10 most voted topic were:

1. Simplification and harmonization of national and supranational legislation. "One-stop shop" for SMEs. Easiness for creation of newco's.
2. Robotics process automation (RPA).
3. R&D financing (Government as first step).
4. Efficiencies and savings through digitalization policies.
5. Adaptation of Curricula to new market demands (i. e. technical schools).
6. Training programs for middle management of SMEs.
7. Meeting social and environmental standards.
8. Promotion of the development of regional economies to ensure a well-balanced growth.
9. Facilitate SMEs access to trade defense laws to avoid negative effects of unfair trade, monopolistic practices and state-owned companies' actions.
10. Financing access effect on business birth rate.
